

Broadway Blast



Musical theater is a play that includes singing and dancing. It is performed on a stage or in a movie. It

was invented by different kinds of artists cooperating to create a new form of entertainment.

Although music has been a part of theater since ancient times in all countries, what we know as "musicals" started in the 1800's in the United Kingdom and America. Writers, musicians, actors and dancers combined parts of opera (a story with all singing) and cabarets (a show of separate songs, dances, and acting) to create a story. **All these parts together help the characters express what is**

happening and what they are thinking and feeling.

In most large cities there are areas with theaters where musicals are performed. In London, United Kingdom it's called The West End. Toronto, Canada has The Entertainment District. In Philadelphia, Avenue of the Arts is where people see musicals. In New York City, it's called **Broadway**, the street where many of the theaters are located. A lot of musicals that start on Broadway are made into movies.
